Beadale Wood, Wrelton

Another stage of tree replacement has been completed in the wood. Forty-five saplings have been planted, under a programme initiated by the Woodland Trust.



This aims to establish a wider variety of native trees in woods dominated by Ash and Sycamore, that are likely to be adversely affected by Ash Dieback. (*ed: cases have been reported in areas in and around Ryedale according to an online map at Defra*).

The varieties planted were English Oak, Hornbeam and Silver Birch. Any donations of native saplings for the wood (which is enjoyed by many locals and visitors) can be left at Foundry Farm.

A dew pond has also been constructed, to encourage more birds and mammals in the wood. There is already evidence of deer using it.

I am extremely grateful for the hard work and support from the High Field Grange shoot in undertaking these projects.

Les was a long-time resident of Wrelton living with his wife, Vera, at the Bungalow just off Goshen. Les lived for his family and for farming and was known as a hard worker all his life. Even after (semi!) retirement he continued driving up to the farm in his pick-up truck every day. He married Vera in 1950 and had a two day honeymoon in Scarborough – the only break from farming he had apart from visiting the sheep sales in Lincolnshire most years. His funeral at Octon Crematorium was well attended by over 100 people.
