The village hall is run by a group of volunteers who meet every two months. Following the meeting in May, Jan Firth was elected as the new Chairperson. We would like to thank Sue Halstead for her work as outgoing Chairperson and to welcome Jan to the role. We would also like to thank outgoing committee member Liz Crouch (ably assisted by husband Graham) who managed the bookings, cleaning duties and various other 'unseen' work done towards the upkeep of the hall.

Currently we are looking for one or two more volunteers for the committee and someone to take over Liz and Graham's cleaning duties. To give you a flavour of what the committee have achieved over the past year here are the edited highlights from the outgoing Chairperson's (Sue Halstead) Annual report.

# Chairperson's Report 2015/2016

## Repairs & Renewals

- 1. Signs the Village Hall name sign was erected during May
- 3.Book case to store books for the funded book exchange a grant received from RAY and built by Terry Firth (Thanks)
- 4. Bolts added to the entrance/exit gates to the Play Area as a safety measure
- 5.A play house was purchased by the existing Playground committee with funding from the PC (community investment fund) & the Village Hall.
- 6. The Hall and stage were re-decorated this year.
- 7. Woodworm & Loft Insulation grants from Ryedale Council were provided to partially fund (50%) treating woodworm found in the loft area above kitchen/mall meeting room and also loft insulation hopefully this will help reduce heating bills.
- 8.Electrics following electric survey carried out by Strickland's which highlighted areas which required immediate modification/renewals we had the work completed in November to be compliant with regulations. We received a grant towards this of £350.00 from RDC. (50%)
- 9. Fire Brigade Audit we invited the Fire brigade inspector to advise/undertake a fire risk assessment and certain areas were highlighted this work was carried out by the electrician and further recommendations will be implemented this coming year.

**Events:-** Harvest Supper, Barn Dance, Book Exchange, Ruth's Craft Fair/Bathsheba's Christmas Fair along with numerous other regular events

#### Other Business

Play Area – the management of the Play area has now been taken on board by the VH committee

Morrison's – following damage to the car park by Morrison vehicles a sum of £150 was received in compensation – this will go towards the financing of resurfacing of the carpark Recipe Book – we are planning a recipe Book to raise funds for the VH and information on this has gone out in the Wrambler. We hope to have the book ready for Christmas.

The Hall curtains have all been taken down and washed. Decided there was no requirement to renew them at this time.

Plans to resurface the car park and re point the car park wall are in hand for this year and also looking at a new Porch or revamping the existing Porch.

Thank you's go to those residents who "get involved" to help us run events & do repairs- too many to mention but they know who they are – so thank you

All the good people who clean the VH and last but certainly not least I would like to thank the committee members for their support, help and commitment through out the year.

They give up their time to volunteer in keeping the Wrelton VH running for the community. *Sue Halstead*
