As reported a couple of months ago the completion of superfast broadband to Wrelton was scheduled for the end of June. Despite there been quite a bit of activity between Aislaby and Wrelton it appears the completion date has been moved back by 4 months to end of October 2017! See SFNY reply below to a recent email from Helen Young. Thanks Helen for keeping us updated!

"The project is run in phases, with each new phase started as additional funds are made available. I can confirm that Wrelton is one of the villages included in Phase 2 of that project. The date of June 2017 was the overall completion date as declared at the start of the project.

Phase 2 which is running across the whole of NorthYorkshire when completed will make superfast fibre broadband accessible to about 90% of properties in the county. This is therefore a large and complex project. While the majority of villages within this phase have indeed been completed by June 2017 there are unfortunately a small number, including Wrelton, that have encountered problems and as a result the completion of the upgrade will be delayed.

I know that this will be a disappointment to residents. HoweverWrelton is still scheduled for completion as a Phase 2 village. The response to the new service has been very positive in villages that have recently been upgraded.

5. Planning (and related items)

a) There were no new planning applications received to consider. b) The Council received information regarding pending decisions and noted the planning applications resolved and still under consideration by Ryedale District Council and NYCC;

17/00115/CLEUD Certificate of Lawfulness in respect of the conversion and use of the buildings known as Dove Tree Cottage and Fat Hen Cottage as holiday cottages as part of the Beech Farm Cottages holiday complex for a period greater than ten years before the date of this application | Beech Farm Cottages Main Street Wrelton Pickering North Yorkshire. *Approved: Subject to only used as holiday accommodation as part of Beach Farm Holliday Cottages.* **6. Finance**

b) Consolidation of the Parish Council bank accounts was discussed and it was agreed to consult the bank to determine what is required to consolidate the Business reserve accounts into the current account and leave the pond account separate. Cllr Peirson to report back at the next meeting.

7. Co-option Richard Peter Wood of Middleton was co-opted to the Council and a declaration of acceptance was completed. Cllr Ward will complete the on-line disclosure of interested in due course. Notices of council vacancy will be removed from Notice boards and web site.

10. General Maintenance

a) Current outstanding items to be included on the next agenda are:

a) Back lane, Wrelton right of way - status. – All requested details (Council Minutes) have been forwarded to RussVarley (Definitive Map Officer) NYCC. Case to be sent to Secretary of State in 2017 as reported in previous minutes.

b) Surveyor to do a full review of the path infrastructure in the villages – work in Middleton has started this item will be removed from future agendas.

13. Cllr Firth reported that the village hall committee would like to organise planning permission for alterations to the village hall porch via the council as the cost for the application is reduced from £200 to £100; no funding would be required from the council. It was agreed that the council will submit on behalf of the village hall. Cllr Firth progress the matter on behalf of the council.

Cllr Peirson reported late receipt of a retrospective planning application Rocklands Lodges Wrelton (17/00507/FUL) for 12 hot tub gazebos, 2 no cabins and a biomass boiler and fuel store that will go to Ryedale Council decision before the next meeting. The Council has no objections.

Cllr Firth reported a verbal request for support regarding the removal of the benches from outside the Buck Inn Wrelton. In order for the council to consider this a written request must be received. Cllr Firth to relay this information to the parishioner.
