North Yorkshire Trading Standards have noticed an increase in northyorkshire reports from residents being contacted by telephone by someone claiming to be from Microsoft, BT, Talk-Talk or similar.

The caller will state they have identified a problem with the router or that the persons email has been 'hacked' They will then trick the recipient into downloading software that allows the caller to remotely access the computer. This may result in the caller claiming they can offer a service to rid the computer of viruses or locking the computer and demanding a fee to unlock. This scam has been around for a while now but we are still seeing residents falling victim. If you get a similar call, hang up and if in doubt contact your internet service provider

Present: Cllrs Peirson (Chairman), Pickering, Quinlan, Wrench, Firth, Cooke, Wilson, Wood


- 1. Apologies for absence were received and accepted from Cllr Lumley.
- 5. Fay Snowden (Ryedale Community Officer) gave an overview of the role of the Community Officer. Included details of grants available, community messaging and a point of contact for any parish council/community related help.
- 6. Planning (and related items)
- a) There were no new planning applications received to consider.
- b) The Council received information regarding pending decisions and noted the planning applications resolved and still under consideration by Ryedale District Council and NYCC;
