RISING ENERGY COSTS?



Now is the time of year when many energy company tariffs come to an end with subsequent renewals being higher. Our potential new contract would have increased costs by £200 per year however we found a much better offer from "Bulb" a small "green" supplier listed with "Uswitch"

Their quote saves us £180 per year so we are almost back to last years costs, the electricity is 100% from renewables and gas is at least 10% from renewables (animal waste). Unlike the big six they have only one tariff, are on-line and ask for payment by debit card in advance initially but you can change to direct debit. There is no fixed term contract or penalties for switching and they will inform users of tariff changes 30 days in advance. They work out your average cost and increase this by 120% for winter months, obviously reducing during summer! - 1. There were no absences.
- 2. Cllr Quinlan declared an Interest in planning item 5a(iv).5. Planning (and related items)
- 3. Minutes and Matters arising
- a) The minutes of the meeting held on 19th September 2017 were approved with amendment to item 8d (Repair of wall along snicket between back land and main road) to "in progress".
- b) There were no matters arising from the meeting 19th September 2017 not covered elsewhere on the agenda.
- 4. No members of the public were present.
- 5. Planning (and related items)

- 6. Finance a) The Financial statement was received and reviewed. It was confirmed the second half of the precept had been received from Ryedale District Council.
- 7. The role of the parish clerk was reviewed and it was agreed to continue without an employed clerk and review again in 6 months (April 2018).
- 8. The council reviewed the details of the application process. It was resolved to apply for an application pack with a view to recording the rights of way were identified as Dams Lane, Wrelton and track from Coppice Lane Wrelton to Marton Lane and review at the next meeting.
- 10. General Maintenance Current outstanding items to be included on the next agenda are:
- a) Back lane, Wrelton right of way status. All requested details (Council Minutes) have been forwarded to Russ Varley (Definitive Map Officer) NYCC. Case to be sent to Secretary of State in 2017 as reported in previous minutes.
- c) Stiles on the path from Wrelton to Sinnington are broken. Cllr Quinlan to report and progress.
- d) Cllr Quinlan reported the path between Wrelton and Riseborough remains closed due to a broken foot bridge. Cllr Quinlan to report and progress.
- 11. The date of the next meeting was noted as Tuesday 21st November 2017 7:30pm.
