Doorstep Sellers!

One of our friends, who is in her 80's and lives in a nearby village, sent us a letter recently and, sadly, recounted the story of how she was robbed by a man selling cleaning goods. We have probably all experienced these men - frequently they are giving a cover story of either being on probation or having left the Army, usually neither of these is true. Some are producing homemade identity documents which have no legal validity. Our friend had the same man around a few times and had bought cleaning items from him previously. He had started coming around to her back door which she did not like. This time he let himself into her house as she could not move quickly enough to get to the door. He stayed a while and once he had left she realised her purse had gone too - she had it out on the kitchen table to pay him for the cleaning goods she had bought from him. The purse was found two weeks later in a muddy ditch and, of course, it was empty. This, as you can imagine, caused our friend a lot of stress and worry. The incident was reported and the Police are involved as a neighbour had seen the man's car and taken the number plate. If you have any doubt about doorstep salesmen do not let them into your house and call the Police 101 (non-emergency) or 999 (emergency).

Village Extract from the Minutes For the Ordinary Meeting of the Aislaby Middleton and Wrelton Parish Council held at the Village Hall, Wrelton on Tuesday 23rd January 2018 at 7:30pm Present: Cllrs Peirson (Chairman), Cooke, Pickering, Firth, Wrench, Wood, Wilson & Lumley.

1. Apologies for absence were received and accepted from Cllr Quinlan.
2. There were no declarations of interests in items on the agenda.
4. No members of the public were present.

5. Planning (and related items)

b) information regarding pending decisions by Ryedale District Council and NYCC:

iii) To replace existing timber double glazed windows and doors with new timber double glazed windows and doors. Designs (i.e. casements and Yorkshire sliders) to be identical to existing. Letter detailing approval was circulated.

7. The council reviewed the following parish grant applications:

Wrelton Grass Cutting – request received from Mr P. Renshaw requesting a donation to £100 in support of the Wrelton grass cutters maintenance and running costs. The council approved the grant request and a cheque was raised for £100.

Wrelton defibrillator – request received from Mrs S. Halstead requesting a donation towards the cost of installing a defibrillator in Wrelton. The council reviewed the information provided and agreed to support the initiative to purchase and install a Defibrillator in Wrelton Village. However before the level of funding is agreed the council requested that additional information should be provided on how the rest of the funding will be achieved. Cllr Peirson will request additional information and report back at the next meeting with a view to agreeing the funding available.

9. General Maintenance

Current outstanding items to be included on the next agenda are:

a) Back lane, Wrelton right of way - status. – NYCC reported the case was due to be sent to Secretary of State in 2017 as reported in previous minutes however due to Russ Varley leaving and no replacement be appointed this has not occurred and no future date of when this will occur can be provided. NYCC suggested the matter could be resolved earlier if the objection was withdrawn. Cllr Quinlan delivered the agreed letter to the party in question on behalf of the Council and is awaiting a response.

b) Stiles on the path from Wrelton to Sinnington are broken. Cllr Quinlan reported to highways and is awaiting a response.

c) Cllr Quinlan reported the path between Wrelton and Riseborough remains closed due to a broken foot bridge. The footbridge has now been replaced and path open this item will be removed from future agendas. Additional items to be added to General Maintenance

Road sweeping in all villages required – Cllr Peirson to request and progress. Blocked road drain in Aislaby West Bound carriageway at entrance to Carr Lane – Cllr Peirson to report and progress.

12. The date of the next meeting was noted as Tuesday 20th February 2018 7:30pm.
