2018 AGM 21st May - Village Hall Committee Chairs Report (slightly edited)

I am pleased to present my second annual report as Chair of the VH Committee. We were delighted to welcome a new member, Chris Bakes maintaining our number at nine. During 2017/18 the Committee met six times. We've had a busy year with lettings, social and fund raising events all managed most efficiently by Jeanette Miller and also maintenance and general upkeep of the Village Hall.

Events

We held a number of social and fund raising events throughout the year.

- Stalls on the Green on Spring Bank Holiday was a great success despite the weather.
- Two barn dances were held and our thanks must go once again to Richard and Anne Abrahall for their time and patience in getting us through the dances. These events raised nearly £400 in total.
- Harvest supper was a sell out as usual. The Thornton Dale Ukelele players entertained us and villagers made the food, which again was finished off on Tidy up Day. Our washer uppers/gentle raffle muggers deserve a special mention for all their hard work.
- Ruth, Keith and Peter Simpson held their annual Christmas Craft Fayre, which raised a good amount of money. The snow on the ground only adding to the festive mood!
- In March Bathsbea and Peter Hartrey took us trekking to Lunana in Northern Bhutan. We are grateful to them for entertaining us and for helping to raise nearly £200
- We held a pre-Christmas village get together for drinks and nibbles, quizzes and festive songs for our talented villagers. This was thoroughly enjoyed by all and will hopefully become a regular event. A donations bucket raised over £100 for Ryedale Special Families. Thanks goes to Jean Clark for getting this event back on the village hall calendar.

We have a number of activities planned this coming year.

- The usual events, stalls on the green next week (bank holiday Monday); harvest supper and tidy up day; pre-Christmas gathering and others, A play: The Kaiser and I on 28th June.

Other Developments include:

- The Lions gave us £100 from their 50th anniversary fund and we put this towards a lighter more manoeverable table tennis table which is used weekly.
- We were awarded £1000 from the Council Stronger Communities fund to install WiFi. This has been done and is now up and running. Its already being used by a couple of regular hall users and will be rolled out over the next few months. The grant enables us to run for two years during which time we will determine the best way to fund it long term. Thanks to Kathy Waddington for leading this work.
- We were awarded a grant of £2000 from the Yorkshire based Jack Brunton Trust and have on order 70 upholstered chairs to replace the plastic ones.
- We are keen to purchase a defibrillator for the village. Unfortunately we were unsuccessful with a Lottery bid, but have £500 pledged from the Parish Council. With some concerted fund raising we hope to raise the necessary funds over the next year.
- Bookings and accompanying documentation is now available from the Village Website which is showing Wrelton as a good place to visit. Thanks to Tony Miller for his work on this.

Repairs and Maintenance

- We are finally in a position to carry out some significant repairs and improvements to the Village Hall over the rest of this year.
- We have obtained planning permission to put brick columns around the posts at the front entrance. This along with redecoration will enhance safety and improve the entrance to the Hall.
- We have obtained estimates and awarded contracts to repair the broken lintels, lower and repoint the boundary wall and resurface the car park. **(continued PTO)**

- This work will cost around £12000 in total and we have to date secured £2500 in grants from the Council and Persimmon Homes Community fund, with more bids being submitted. The generosity of villagers has enabled considerable funds to be raised over the past few years.

- Particular thanks must go to Peter Renshaw for all his work in getting us ready to begin the work.

We relaunched the invitation for villagers to become 'friends of the Village Hall' and I am delighted to report we now have over a dozen villagers willing to help out when needed. To this end we once again carried out general tidying up and maintenance at the October tidy up day where we also finished off the food from Harvest Supper. A group of volunteers is also rostered to check monthly that the play equipment is in good order with Gayle Williams taking the lead on this.

As you can see, we have a very active Village, with the Village Hall at its hub. I would like to conclude by thanking all villagers and the Committee for all their hard work and commitment this year to keeping the Hall running for the benefit of the Wrelton community. My personal thanks to Sue Halstead for her continued guidance.
