### Wrelton Village Show - 9th August 2020 - 2-4pm



When VE Day dawns on 8th May 2020 it will be 75 years since the guns fell silent at the end of the war in Europe. Years of carnage and destruction had come to an end and millions of people took to the streets and pubs to celebrate peace, mourn their loved ones and to hope for the future, but not forgetting those still in conflict until 15th August when it was announced that Japan had surrendered unconditionally to the Allies, effectively ending World War II.

Unfortunately the Coronavirus emergency and consequent Government guidance means the majority of the VE Day 75 community celebrations due to take place on the bank holiday weekend of 8th - 10th May have been cancelled.

But, if you wish to join in to pay tribute to the service and sacrifice of the entire Second World War generation, from British, Commonwealth and Allied Forces to evacuees and those who served on the home front there are online events taking place a few of which are below.

The Royal British Legion are organising a live VE Day 75 webcast at 11.15am and a UK-wide singalong to Vera Lynn's 'Well Meet Again' at 9pm - see their website for further details. https://www.britishlegion.org.uk

Leading up to the 9pm singalong The Vintage Vocalist, Paula Marie, who appeared at Wrelton Village Hall in February, will be having a live singalong on her Facebook page (will you be joining in Sandra??)

In the afternoon there is a 'Nation's Toast to the Heroes of WW2' at 3pm on the 8th May. From the safety of your own home raise a glass of refreshment of your choice and undertake the following 'Toast' — "To those who gave so much, we thank you," using this unique opportunity to pay tribute to the many millions at home and abroad that gave so much.

"Whilst VE Day marked the beginning of the end of the SecondWorldWar, many thousands of Armed Forces personnel were still involved in bitter fighting in the Far East. We remember the contribution of all Allied Forces, including forces from across the Commonwealth, without who the liberation of Europe and Japan would not have been possible. The SecondWorldWar had a profound impact on communities across the UK and the Commonwealth which continued long after the war came to an end. The challenges of leaving, longing for and returning home were experienced by many people at the time and are still faced by Service families today."
