### WRELTON OF OLD



WRELTON was inhabited long before recorded history and became, after the Ice Age a settlement on the edge of the Lake of Pickering (now known as the Vale of Pickering). During the Roman invasion it stood on the route from Derventia (Malton) to Wade 's causeway on Stape Moor. Close inspection of some of the old buildings show what good use was made of this source of free stonework. In Georgian times the people of Wrelton would have seen many travellers, when coaches trundled their way to Scarborough and Whitby.

An Original Wrelton Foundry Kitchen Range in Croft Head Photo: the Editor Then there were several alehouses and Inns-the Red Lion, White Hart

and the Buck. Old mounting steps can still be seen outside Croft Head. Methodism had an immediate effect on the Village as Wesley actively discouraged alcohol and wine -making (hence Vinery Farm) and gradually the Inns disappeared leaving only the Buck which remains to this day.

The first Chapel was the Wesleyan in 1814 followed by the Primitive Methodist in 1840. Both thrived encouraging reading and basic education. Donations allowed free meals of bread and broth to be prepared in a coal fired copper. The Chapels boasted two small orchestras and thriving choirs. The Squire at Wrelton Hall was thought to be the only C of E in the Village!

During the 19th Century the Foundry—sited in the Goshen\*—made use of the iron produced in Rosedale. It specialised in kitchen ranges but the only trace of the foundry is in the name Foundry Farm and Cottages. It is said that the waste from the foundry formed the base of the adjacent road-the original metalled road? \* GOSHEN: A place of comfort and plenty...Genesis 45:10
