VILLAGE HALL NEWS

Due to the recent lockdown the Village Hall has been closed to most of the groups who hire it on a regular basis (except Sharing the Word faith group who are carrying on their regular Sunday morning sessions). When we can re-open fully will depend on official guidance. This has, unfortunately, meant lost revenue.

Government grants have been available through Ryedale District Council and the committee have made successful applications for these funds. This has enabled us to cover our regular outgoings, provide funds for essential maintenance and plan for the future when we can re-open.

Village Hall Committee Meeting

The Village Hall Committee met via Zoom on 18th January 2021.

The following items were reported:-

A new salt bin has been provided and placed near the entrance of the Hall.

The disabled toilet radiator has a broken valve and this will be replaced.

The Village show is still planned to go ahead and all sponsors of the show have agreed to carry their sponsorship over to this year.

The climbing frame in the playground will be replaced. The Committee have obtained quotes for the replacement and are currently considering different options. The Solar Panel Feasability Study was discussed and the Committee would like to thank Peter Anderson for his helpful contribution on looking at the report and providing helpful ideas and suggestions to question the presentation at the next stage of the process.

A questionaire for Ryedale District Council has been completed and photographs and a plan has been sent to them to ensure Covid-secure premisies for the May elections. next meeting via Zoom is on Monday 1st March 2021 at 7pm

Solar Panel Feasability Study
