CENSUS 2021

The census is a survey that happens every 10 years conducted by the Office of National Statistics. It takes place this year on Sunday March 21st. All kinds of organisations, from local authorities to charities, use the information to help provide the services we all need, including transport, education and healthcare. Census 2021 is a digital-first census, which means that people will be encouraged to respond online if they can. Most households will receive a unique code in the post allowing them to complete their census online. More help and information will be available nearer the time especially for those unable to gain online access. NB. Don't forget we have internet access at the Village Hall if required. 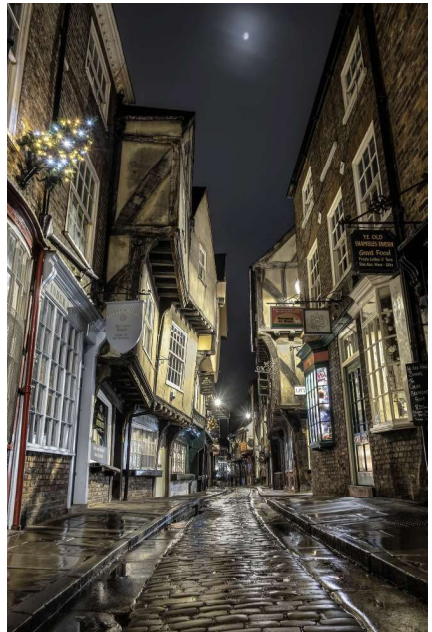
Local Photographer - Martin Williams

This still life example is entitled 'the art of electronics' and combines his day job as electronics engineer with his passion for photography. Lit using a single torch creating multiple exposures, the images are then combined in Photoshop.

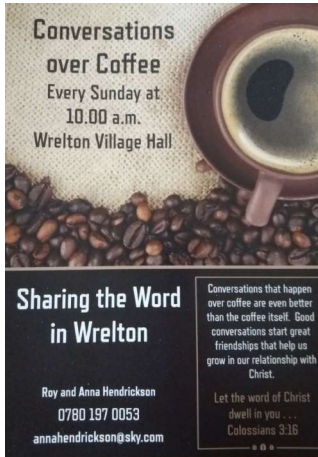


