Wrelton Village Hall AGM - Monday 14th June 2021
(Abridged and edited version)

Chair's Report

The AGM in 2020 had to be postponed until October 13th when Covid restrictions briefly allowed us to have a face to face meeting in the village hall and therefore this AGM meeting is returning to the correct time slot and is therefore reporting on a shorter period of time. The Hall has gradually reopened to regular users since April but with reduced numbers. There has been an associated loss of income (detailed in the Treasurer's report) but we have been well supported by grants from Ryedale District Council which means we have been able to offer reduced rates to regular users to allow them to get up and running again. Committee meetings have been held via Zoom.

The annual Christmas event became a Christmas quiz that was accessed via the village website.

Committee

Following the AGM in October the structure of the committee was reviewed following proposals from the Chair in order to divide up the responsibilities for aspects of the hall. In addition to the single person roles of Chair, Vice chair, Treasurer, Secretary and bookings clerk sub- committees have been formed for events, maintenance, the garden and the playground with defined roles and decision making responsibilities. Each subcommittee will report back to the full

committee at the monthly meeting.

Unfortunately, Jeannette Miller is resigning from the committee at this meeting and I would like to thank her for her sterling service as Treasurer and Booking's clerk over recent years. She has made a huge contribution to the running of the hall since 2016 and they will be very difficult shoes to fill. We have appealed for new members and I am pleased to welcome Michael and Honor Dowse to the committee.

Playground

As this facility was initially installed in 2010 it has begun to show some signs of wear and tear and the climbing frame became unstable with rotting supports. This has now been removed and replaced by a smaller unit suitable for young children and a set of monkey bars for the older age range. In addition the zip wire has needed some addition due to metal fatigue- the work has now been completed and the park is now fully open again. The work was financed by grants and donations and we are very grateful to the following for their support : Mark Goodson at Wayside Park, Greg White NYCC councillor via a community fund, Ryedale District Council and the Parish Council

Continuing to look ahead I hope that the future will resemble a return to normality.

We have various plans that should make next year's report fuller:

Stalls on the Green on June 27th

The first Wrelton Village Show on 8th August (postponed from last year)

We welcome back Dominic Goodwin for a rerun of the excellent Holmes and Watson production on September 4th

We also look forward to our regular users getting back to normal and the hall welcoming more and more of the community to events, clubs and societies

Finally I would like to say a huge thank you to everyone who volunteers to enable to the hall to keep going- the committee, cleaning volunteers and Friends of the Village Hall.

It is an essential village amenity which depends on goodwill and commitment.
