Wrelton Village Defibrillator

CHD (coronary heart disease) is responsible for around 64,000 deaths in the UK each year, an average of 175 people each day, or one death around every eight minutes. More than 900,000 people in the UK are living with heart failure.

These figures speak for themselves and so the VH committee took the decision to raise money to purchase and install a defibrillator in our village back in 2018. Funds had to be raised and the defibrillator was finally purchased installed outside Beech Farm Cottages on 25th September 2019. and went live on 17th October 2019.

It is run under a managed scheme provided by the Community Heartbeat Trust. Volunteers from Wrelton carry out weekly checks on the defibrillator. The defibrillator has been needed on two occasions and I am pleased to report that it was not activated on either occasion but was there as a precautionary measure.

There are currently three "Guardians" who carry out the site checks and input reports online.

Following a request in the Wrambler for more volunteers, Peter Hartrey has joined Chris Bakes and myself in managing the weekly checks and reports. I would like to thank Graham Kirk and Phil Hanby for their help in monitoring the defibrillator during the last 2 years. And Graham and Kirsty Kirk for allowing the installation of the defibrillator on one of the cottage walls.

Hopefully the defibrillator will not need to be activated but it is reassuring that we have our own village defibrillator ready to save a life.

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**Wrelton Village Extracts from the Minutes (Draft)
Of the Ordinary Meeting of the Aislaby Middleton and
Wrelton Parish Council held at Wrelton Village Hall on
Tuesday 21st September 2021 at 7.30pm**

Present: Cllrs Peirson (chair), Lumley, Quinlan, Baird, Cook, A. Robinson, C. Robinson.

1. Apologies: Cllrs. Pickering (Illness).
2. There were no declarations of interest in item on the agenda.
3. a) Minutes of the previous meeting held on 24th August 2021 were approved.
- b) No matters arising not on the agenda.
4. There were no members of the public present.
5. Planning (and related items).
- b) To receive information regarding pending decisions and note the planning applications still under consideration by Ryedale District Council and NYCC outstanding;
- iii) Non-material minor amendment to planning approval 21/00519/FUL dated 4.05.2021 to allow 1no. previously approved opaque window to west elevation to be omitted and 1no. previously approved door to be replaced with new window and infill wall below Vintners Cottage Wrelton Pickering North Yorkshire YO18 8PF
Ref. No: 21/01157/AMEND | Received: Thu 12 Aug 2021 | Validated: Thu 12 Aug 2021 |
Status: Registered Notes as approved.

The council wished it noted that planning application 21/00189/FUL from April 2021 had not been received by the council, and therefore we had not had the opportunity to comment upon it. It was noted as refused by Ryedale District Council.

6. No new grant applications have been received.

7. Financial information:

- a) Financial statement received and approved. The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) was noted.

8. General Maintenance/villages

- a) Back lane Wrelton – The planning inspectorate completed the site visit on 14.09.2021. The council were not notified so did not attend the inspection, Cllr. Peirson to determine why.
- c) Wrelton village sign. It was noted that the old village sign on Cliff Road shows signs of damage or possible attempted theft, No further action required.
- d) The blockage of roadside gutters in the parish was noted. Cllr. Peirson to request Highways to clean up.

9. Reports from Councillors on delegated matters.

- a) Overgrown footpath on A170 between Aislaby and Middleton has now been cut back at Parish Council expense.
- b) Application to Ryedale District Council Tree Scheme was successful, the council will receive 3 trees i.e. 1 pre village. Discussion took place on potential sites for them. Suggest both Stuart Plant (Middleton) & Tony Miller (Wrelton) as editors of the local newsletters were notified and included in discussions before final decision. The trees should arrive in November.
10. Cllr Cooke had received complaints regarding the new timetable/route of the 128 bus service. These to be forwarded on to East Yorkshire Motor Services via the Council.

11. It was noted that the date of the next ordinary meeting is the 19th October 2021.
