Being Bee Aware (No Mow May)

The idea is to delay the grass cutting of the Green to allow bees and other insects to have time to increase their living and collecting space.

The impetus behind "No Mow May" is to give pollinators, like bees, more time to undertake their work. The mow-free period allows more flowers to grow so pollinators can collect more nectar. Postponing the mowing session until June can help plants create enough nectar for up to 10 times more bees and other pollinators.

"Dandelions are a particular superfood for bees and butterflies. Despite being outnumbered by daisies 85 to 1 on a typical 100m² lawn, they produce 9% of the lawn's pollen and 37% of its nectar sugar." <https://www.countryfile.com/news/no-mow-may-why-you-should-lock-up-your-lawnmower-on-1st-may/>
