

A Wrelton Archive

Firstly, I would like to thank all those who have purchased a copy of 'The History of Wrelton' and especially those who have been kind enough to say nice things about it. Many have asked when Volume II will be available but, at the moment there is no further book being planned.



However, while researching the book, much information has come to light and it was always the intention to gather this together in the form of some permanent village archive. This is, mainly, Helen's idea as she undertook much of the research on my behalf and uncovered many fascinating details which did not find their way into the book.

Things are still in the planning stage but the aim is to gather as much as possible and write it down or store it digitally. We will probably produce a series of binders, to be kept at the Village Hall, covering a variety of topics including 'People', 'Buildings' and 'Events'. There is already a village history section on the website and we will probably look to expand it.

Tony Miller, who organises the website, has agreed to help with that side of things but if anyone thinks they have any other skills which would be useful please get in touch. What we need, initially, is help with gathering information. Anything, no matter how small it may seem, is of interest. We have only lived here for 11 years, though I do have 19th century family connections to the village. What we need is for those, particularly those of advanced years, to provide any stories or memories. Please, write them down, look for that old photograph or just get in touch. Nothing is too trivial.

You will, hopefully, find a section on this topic every month in the Wrambler and to start things off I would ask you to look at the Wrelton Village website. Look for 'History of Wrelton', then 'The Writing on the Wall'. This was first put in the Wrambler in June 2018. It was repeated in April 2020 and then, in May 2020, when Tony Brownbridge's solution to the question set in the poem was published. Recently, Helen has looked at the poem again and believes she has deciphered some of the missing words. She has also researched some of the names on the wall. Interested? More next month.

Parish Council - Traffic Consultation

The Parish Council discussed 'Traffic in Wrelton' at their last meeting on the 19th September. Various suggestions were made to make the roads safer or reduce the speeds through the village. One was to reduce the speed limit to 20mph on all roads, but especially on Goshen and Main St./High St. As this is currently in the news (Wales), Councillor Quinlan volunteered to consult villagers before the next meeting. This is prior to the Parish Council formally applying to North Yorkshire Council for this. Another suggestion was speed humps.

The Parish Council did decide to look into the possibility and cost of a mobile speed camera (one of those with the smiley face if you're under the speed limit) to record or monitor speeds to see how big a problem there actually is.
