In December we looked at some Wrelton Street names and a little information about the Buck Inn on what, in the late 18th century, was King's Street.

At the same time it would seem that the village's centre was much as it is today, though farm buildings have been converted to homes and some have disappeared altogether. The land (and buildings) known as Belmont, together with that known as Rose Lea and Rose Cottage would appear to have been in common ownership. An indenture dated 18th June 1653, in the possession of the present owners of Rose Lea, is evidence of this ownership until the properties were sold separately in 1875.

The earlier documents are mainly in the possession of the Simpson family (owners of Rose Lea) while those relating to Belmont, as a separate holding, belong to the Miller family (who run it as a B&B). In 1653 the owners were Thomas and William Gill of Wrelton and then, until 1808, members of a family named Storry.

The properties have several other owners and tenants before passing into the hands of a Malton innkeeper, Thomas Vickerman, in 1837. He seems to have had financial difficulties, mortgaging the Belmont site in 1856 and renting out the other.

In 1857 the Vickermans emigrated to East Lackawannock, Mercer county, U.S.A. He died in 1887, having sold the Wrelton properties. Matthew Ward, a yeoman of Wrelton, paid £520 for Belmont, while John Boddy of Pickering bought the Rose Lea/Cottage site for £200. The two parcels of land have remained in separate ownership to this day. Vickerman is an unusual name. Coming soon, some other names to conjure with from Wrelton's past.

JOHN STOCKTON EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION

Small Grants available to students and apprentices, aged 18-25

John Stockton, a yeoman farmer, died in 1841 and left a sum of money in trust for the purpose of putting children in school to be taught and instructed in reading, writing and arithmetic in specific 'townships'. Today the Foundation gives small grants to students, usually at degree level, and to apprentices, covering the purchase of such items as relevant

books, stationery, equipment, fees and tools. To qualify applicants must have lived in the parishes listed for a period of not less than two years and be aged 18 (in the academic year of application) and under 25 years of age.

The parishes include:- Aislaby, Middleton, Wrelton, Cropton. (Full list of parishes available on Wrelton website www.wreltonvillage.uk) Governors meet twice a year to consider applications.

The closing date for the April Meeting is 25th March.

The closing date for the October Meeting is 25th September.
