A Wrelton Archive by Richard Young Glee in Wrelton (Part 2)

Music was much in evidence at Wrelton School, particularly during the headship of Maud E. Wells. (1913 - 1943). Over a number of years it took part in the Eskdale Tournament of Song and the Scarborough Eistedford, where numerous certificates and trophies were won. (see opposite) In 1936 the Eskdale adjudicators declared "they had never heard such good singing for a very long time." A prominent member of this group was Steven Welford who would go on to train as a tenor, took principal roles with local musical societies and later took part in a wide variety of opera and musical shows nationally and internationally. He made several recordings on radio and performed with several famous singers of the time such as Owen Brannigan John Hanson and Moira Anderson.

The local chapels were also well known for their singing and it is believed that they encouraged the playing of instruments, having at least one orchestra at one time. Not to be outdone, the local church, based on St. Andrew's at Middleton, held its annual concert at the Buck, where according to the Yorkshire Herald of 29th January 1870, "several songs, glees and anthems were much applauded, and the National Anthem concluded the proceedings."

Today Wrelton has no 'Glee' singers, choir nor orchestra but several of our villagers do perform with local choirs and bands. There is even one gentleman who played the French horn as a military musician with the Royal Artillery and then taught others before taking a well-earned retirement. Interestingly it was their shared musical ability which brought him and his wife together. She played the flute alongside him when, after leaving the army, he performed in orchestra pits the length and breadth of Britain.

There is one occasion when villagers still sing together. For the past few years a Christmas gathering at Belmont has provided the opportunity for voices to be raised in glee!
