

Minutes (Draft) Of the ordinary meeting of the Aislaby, Middleton and Wrelton Parish council (Wrelton Extracts)

held at Wrelton Village Hall on Tuesday 27th August 2024 at 7:30pm

- 9. General Maintenance/Villages.
- a) Street lighting issues and repairs progress. LED upgrade appears piecemeal. Further information requested from Highways by email from the meeting. Awaiting reply.
- b) Japanese Knotweed in **Beadale Wood**. Continuing to monitor.
- e) Hedge and verge cutting. Ref. 101010602661. Highways will not do the requested maintenance. Decision to leave this until winter when foliage reduced and the Parish Council to assess if they should carried out the work.
- 10. To receive reports from Councillors on delegated matters.
- a) Cllr. Quinlan, Speed concern awareness and community speed watch.

No further information.

- b) Information regarding vehicle activated signs (VAS).
- Response from North Yorkshire Council Councillor Greg White requesting additional information and offering to pursue a 30mph limit instead. If this proves not possible funding might be available towards the cost of the VAS. Reply drafted accepting the offer to pursue a 30mph limit.
- c) Plaque for copper beach on **Goshen Green, Wrelton**. Plaque done and collected by Cllr. Robinson. To be delivered for installation.
- e) Regarding Land Registry from **Wrelton** greens. The chairman contacted Crombie-Wilkinson solicitors to enquire how to take this further. Mr. James Cornforth undertook initial checks and found that both Greens were registered to the Parish Council as owners by North Yorkshire County Council (NYCC), one in 1977 and one in 1979. These were not registered at the Land Registry as at that time this was not universally done. However, Mr. Cornforth forwarded email copies of both documents to the chairman which members noted. This registration was confirmed as noted as a common land registration on the acraew.org.uk website when notified to them by NYCC and referenced as 'Wrelton CL.46 pdf and dated as
- 22.10.2008. Based on this information it was considered unnecessary to continue with Land Registry registration, partly due to costs which are approx. £1400 per application. This matter is now considered complete. It was suggested that a short article be prepared for publishing in the 'Wrambler' regarding the ownership of the Greens and Cllr. Quinlan agreed to do this.
- f) Regarding field run off between Aislaby and **Wrelton**. No further response to any enquiries. The Parish Council feels it can do no more at this stage, so this is to be removed

from our agenda.

- h) Advertisement of councillor vacancies No responses. Advertisements to continue.
