Smoked mackerel pate with pickled cucumber and toast

Ham, cheddar & Branston Pickle croquettes with garlic mayonnaise

Cream of mushroom soup with herb croutons [v]

Mains

Classic fish pie (salmon & smoked haddock) with seasonal vegetables

Chicken breast wrapped in streaky bacon with a creamy wild mushroom & tarragon sauce, chicken croquette, chips and seasonal veg

Braised puy lentils with honey-glazed butternut squash, broad beans, feta cheese, wood-roasted red peppers & a green herb salsa [v]

Sausage & mash served with vegetables and onion gravy

Beef bourguignon with creamy mash, roast carrot, tenderstem broccoli and red cabbage
