Parish Council Vacancies

What is the Parish Council (PC)?

A group of local people elected by local residents of Aislaby, Middleton & Wrelton villages to represent local interests to higher elected bodies eg NYC or to local authorities eg Yorkshire Water, Highways etc.

There is a maximum of nine members, previously divided to three from each village. Currently there are three from Wrelton, two from Aislaby and one from Middleton leaving three vacancies which we have decided will be allocated to anyone interested in joining from any of the three villages. What does the PC actually do?

- a. We are notified of any planning applications within our boundary and have the opportunity to comment, for or against. Only residents immediately affected by an application are normally notified personally.
- b. We have a small budget, drawn from your council tax (check your latest Council Tax demand from NYC). This can be used by us in various ways:
- i. Residents may apply for a grant to progress a project/piece of work which will benefit the villages, which the PC vets for suitability (& amount!)
- ii. Money may be spent on minor infrastructure items which we cannot get higher authorities to do. Examples from this financial year (2024-5) include covering the cost of cutting the village greens (petrol & maintenance of mower only-labour by volunteers ..more always welcome!), rebuilding of a damaged wall above a culvert on Marton Lane on Health & Safety grounds which Highways agreed to contribute to when pushed by us, running the speed surveys in Wrelton Main St and on the A170 in Aislaby, clearing the path on the A170 through Aislaby when Highways ignored our request (although they have now done Old Rd. to Wrelton).

We have the intention to do more small projects this year and would welcome suggestions from residents. Every PC meeting, held on the final Tuesday of each month except December, in Wrelton VH, has a 'Public Session' where these can be discussed but if you want a say in the decision, you need to join us.
