Parish Council News

Further to last month's report on broken stiles on the footpath from the village to Sinnington, we received this email from Mr Reed of Low Coppice Farm:



"First of all as one of the Landowners concerned I apologise to any villager who was unable to use the footpath safely. Within 48 hours of receiving the letter from Mr Walton I gave instructions on 2nd November 2025 for the offending stile to be removed. Frankly, with the decrease in livestock on farmland, many of the stiles serve no useful purpose. They are an impediment to an enjoyable walk particularly for the less mobile of us. It was advancing age and decreased mobility on my part that caused the deterioration of the stile to go unnoticed.

Secondly, I think most readers will be aware who the landowners are so if any further problems occur please make contact directly. This will lead to quicker repairs and will save the costs of the R.O.W. officer having to attend, an expense that is borne by the ratepayers.
