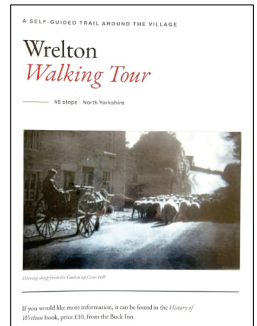


TIDY-UP DAY at the Village Hall
